How many <u>educational professionals</u> does your Site impact through Professional Learning?	Approximately 5-600, however, all information is shared from teacher to teacher in their respective schools, so the exponential impact is much higher. Many media specialists share with all teachers within their school & many have created special school wide programs to disseminate the information gleaned from our programs & resources. These are numbers that include programs we do with our partners throughout the year.
Approximately how many <u>students</u> does the Site impact per year?	If each of the teachers who attended our Institute over the course of 15 years (approximately 600) teaches 5 classes of approximately 30 students, the number of students impacted is approximately 90,000.
